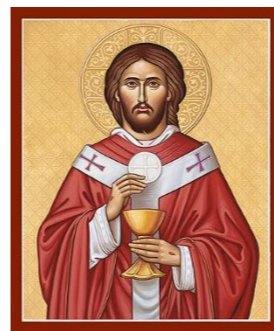

May the initiatives of prayer and of activity associated with this Day strengthen an awareness of vocation within our families, our parish communities, our communities of consecrated life, and our ecclesial associations and movements. The Spirit of the risen Lord dispels our apathy and grants us the gifts of sympathy and empathy. In this way, he enables us to live each day born anew as children of the God who is love (cf. *1 Jn* 4:16) and in turn to offer that love to others. Altar Servers

**ALTAR SERVERS** Being an altar server is a brilliant job at Mass! Altar servers lend a hand getting everything ready in the church before Mass time. They help the priest and all the people to celebrate the Mass. Altar servers can also help at funerals and weddings too! Altar servers keep an eye to make sure the bells are rung at the right time, reminding everyone it's a special moment in the Mass. They look after the books, the chalice, the candles and many other things as well. Usually kids can begin altar serving once they have made their first Holy Communion. You can start at any age and keep serving even when at secondary school. So if you'd like to be an altar server watch this space over the next few weeks!

**PARISH PASTORAL ASSEMBLY** Following on from the Holy Hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament parishioners of various age and backgrounds will be approached to assist with the institution of the Pastoral Assembly for the Donore & Duleek parishes. Let us continue to pray for this process of pastoral vigor just as the first believers did as we read in the Acts of the Apostles. "As the Diocese considers how best to plan and manage its pastoral care, mission, and sacramental life, in some instances parishes are 'linked' to one another in a way that acknowledges the historical, geographical, faith and cultural identities of the parishes involved and is consistent with conciliar theology, especially the ecclesiology of Vatican II. In such instances, the Bishop will entrust the pastoral and spiritual leadership of both parishes to a Parish Priest and request the establishment of a single/common Parish Pastoral Assembly. [ ] The key to linked-parishes engaging in deeper collaboration is an attitude of cooperation which results in finding opportunities for sharing resources to strengthen the missionary and sacramental life in each parish. Since the Parish Pastoral Assembly is involved in planning rather than implementation, and since the two linked-parishes 'pastored' by one person are usually in close proximity, collaboration in some areas and ministries is not only good but advisable. Assembly members should be aware of all ministries, services and events of both parishes." *Best Practice for Parish Pastoral Assemblies 2023-2026 Diocese of Meath*
