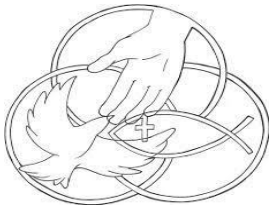

CLERICAL APPOINTMENTS Fr Stephen Kennedy, IVE, Adm. and Fr Brendan O'Rourke, IVE, CC have been appointed Adm. and Curate of Duleek & Bellewstown and will take up residence in Duleek from the 4th July. They are both originally from Dublin and were ordained priests for the Institute of the Incarnate Word in 2015 and 2016 respectively. Fr Stephen received his training in the International Seminary "San Vitaliano" in Montefiascone and is currently studying for a licentiate in Canon Law at the University of Louvain, Belgium. He had worked in 2 parishes in Italy before going to Holy Family parish and more recently Ashbourne parish. Fr Brendan received his training at the Pontifical University, Maynooth along with our Fr. Declan, and at the Institute of the Incarnate Word American Seminary at Chillum, Washington, DC. Prior to his current appointment in Ashbourne, he was assigned to Holy Family parish and St. Anthony of Padua, Massachusetts.



"Father and Son. It is a familiar image which, if we think about it, disrupts our images of God. Indeed, the very word "God" suggests to us a singular, majestic and distant reality, whereas hearing about a Father and a Son brings us back home. Yes, we can think of God in this way, through the image of a *family gathered around the table*, where life is shared. After all, the table, which, at the same time is an altar, is a symbol with which certain icons depict the Trinity. It is an image that speaks to us of a *God of communion*. Father, Son and Holy Spirit: *communion*. But it is not only an image; it is reality! It is reality because the Holy Spirit, the Spirit that the Father poured into our hearts through Jesus (cf. *Gal 4:6*), makes us taste, makes us savour God's presence: a presence that is always close, compassionate and tender.

The Holy Spirit does with us what Jesus does with Nicodemus: he introduces us to the mystery of new birth, the birth of faith, of Christian life, he reveals the heart of the Father to us, and he makes us partake in God's very life. We could say that the invitation he extends to us is to sit at the table with God to share in his love. This is the image. This is what happens at every Mass, at the altar of the Eucharistic table, where Jesus offers himself to the Father and offers himself for us. Yes, that is how it is, brothers and sisters, our God is a *communion of love*: and this is how Jesus revealed him to us." *Pope Francis*
