PRAYER FOR GAZA ON 24TH AUGUST

On Sunday week, 24 August, parishes across Ireland are invited to unite once more in a Day of Prayer for Gaza. The Archbishop of Armagh, Eamon Martin, said, "Only a short ten weeks ago, the Catholic Bishops of Ireland called for the month of June to be a time of

prayer and solidarity with the suffering people of Gaza. Heartbreakingly, since then, the situation has deteriorated further. Innocent lives continue to be lost, many of them children and families while hunger, violence and devastation tighten their grip on a people caught in the crossfire. The Bishops of Ireland have condemned, in the strongest terms, the genocidal acts being carried out with the sanction of the Israeli government, actions that have led to the deaths of tens of thousands of civilians. As Pope Leo reminds us, "Every human being has an intrinsic dignity bestowed by God Himself."

We pray especially for the priests and religious sisters of the Religious Family of the Incarnate Word, who serve in Holy Family Parish, Gaza.
