FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY & JOSEPH



Today we celebrate the Feast Day of the Holy Family. We recall that God Himself was born into a human family, with the Blessed Virgin Mary as mother, and St. Joseph as foster-father. Today we ask God to bless all of the families in our parish in a special way, as we seek to imitate the virtues which we admire in the Holy Family: love, unity, patience, and generosity.

PRAYER TO THE HOLY FAMILY

Jesus, Son of God and Son of Mary, bless our family; help us to put You at the centre of our family, so that we may experience the love that you experienced in the Holy Family. Mary, Mother of Jesus, nourish our family with Your faith and love; help us to be pure, kind, gentle, and self-sacrificing. St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary and foster father of Jesus, protect our family and keep it safe from harm; obtain for all fathers the grace of strength, wisdom, and prudence. Holy Family of Nazareth: Make our family and home more and more like Yours, a place of communion, prayer, and peace, until we are one family in heaven with You.



SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD & WORLD DAY OF PEACE – 1^{ST} JANUARY 2026 As well as being New Year's Day, the 1^{St} of January is a special feast day in our church calendar, in which we celebrate that Mary is the Mother of God. This feast day dates back to the Council of Ephesus in the year 431 AD, when the Divine Maternity was solemnly declared for the first time as dogma of the Catholic Church. We pray in a special way to Our Lady on this day, and

ask her to pray for us and for our parish. This day is also the World Day of Peace, in which we ask God to bring peace to all areas of the world afflicted by war and conflict. In his message for

the World Day of Peace, Pope Leo XIV called for "a peace which is unarmed and disarming, humble and persevering", as we remember Our Lord's first words to His Apostles when He rose from the dead: "Peace be with you!"
